Academic Life

Inspiring confident girls and learners

Academic life at Tormead Prep School is purposeful and exciting, with a strong focus on academic progress and achievement.

Our dedicated and inspirational teachers are passionate about teaching and bringing all subjects to life. They will build and nurture your daughter's individual talents and skills whilst helping her to understand that mistakes are an essential part of any learning.

A Digital Curriculum developing expertise and confidence in using technology

As an Apple Distinguished School, your daughter will develop expertise and confidence in using technology. From Reception to Year 4, class sets of iPads support learning in lessons and from Year 5, the girls use their own devices. We are proud of the creativity and intellectual curiosity our girls display and, by using technology safely and responsibly, IT lessons build up the skills and confidence of our girls in areas such as coding, e-safety and data handling.

Higher Order Thinking is at the core of our educational philosophy at Tormead

We believe that all pupils have the potential to succeed as high performers given the right encouragement and supportive learning environment.

Each girl at Tormead Prep is unique and the school's academic programme reflects this. Our teachers engage their classes with activities that require fluidity, creativity and outside the box thinking. Building on the firm foundations set in Pre-Prep, the girls take an active part in their own education. Using learning skills such as curiosity, creativity, collaboration, reflectiveness, resourcefulness and resilience (taught and modelled by the teachers), the girls are encouraged to build on their knowledge, through a multi-faceted approach to their understanding.

In Pre-Prep, girls will be taught German. In addition, French will be introduced in Year 3 along with Spanish and Latin in Year 5.

Specialist Teaching

All girls enjoy specialist teaching in Music, Languages, Games and Gymnastics, and from Year 2 to Year 6 in Design Technology.

Critical Thinking

From Year 1 girls are taught 'Critical Thinking'. This covers a broad range of topics encompassing Philosophy and independence of thought.

STEM

The teaching of STEM subjects (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) is an intrinsic part of daily life and teaching at Tormead Prep School.

A cross-curricular approach to planning and delivering our programme of study ensures that the girls have multiple opportunities to understand and apply the skills of inquiry-based learning used in STEM subjects.

This interdisciplinary approach to learning equips girls for a world where the ability to think critically and to evaluate is crucial. Visits to museums, guest speakers, and a range of school clubs, such as coding, art, Lego and science clubs, develop and extend the opportunities for girls to make links between the classroom and the real world.

We aim to foster a real love and enthusiasm for STEM and each year, the whole school takes part in Inquisitor Week. Through visiting groups, speakers, activities and lessons, the emphasis is on developing further knowledge and understanding of STEM skills.

At Tormead Prep we aim to teach the girls that education is not just for school.













Pastoral Care

How do we provide outstanding pastoral care for your daughter?

We are passionate about creating a warm and supportive environment where the wellbeing of our community members (girls, teachers, support staff and parents) is at the very heart of everything we do. We nurture the Tormead values of respect, tolerance and inclusivity and our girls develop good friendships because kindness is at the core of our pastoral success in our very close-knit community.

Tormead Prep's pastoral care is second to none.

Tormead Prep is a safe learning environment where the girls feel happy and comfortable. The Form Teachers are friendly and approachable and provide the outstanding pastoral care your daughter requires over the year. They will be your contact point should you need to discuss the emotional wellbeing of your child in addition to her academic progress. The Form Teachers aim to develop a strong partnership with you through parent meetings and consultations and together you will connect as a team to support your daughter as she journeys through the academic year.

We know that children can find navigating friendships tricky and errors will be made. Just as in any family, there will be times when the girls may require help from an adult. Here at Tormead Prep, we take the time to mentor and guide the girls with their friendships through teaching and encouraging them to learn from their mistakes. Teachers will discuss and model how to make the correct choices in the future.

Specialist Support Team

We are fortunate to have specialist pastoral staff at Tormead. Our School Nurses, Emotional Literacy Support Assistant (ELSA) and School Counsellors can support our Prep School girls should the need ever arise.

Kindness and care outside the Tormead Prep community

We are keen to ensure that the girls are thoughtful to others in our wider community. Our House Captains organise events to raise money for different charities over the year. We are proud to have connected with Age UK Surrey and continue to work to support the Guildford Foodbank. We want our girls to have empathy and understanding of issues in the real world, be that locally or globally.

Sport

Prep School sport aims to develop the girls' skills and understanding, along with a passion for a wide range of sports.

In the Autumn and Spring Terms, girls in Key Stage 2 participate in cross country, gymnastics, hockey, netball and swimming. We encourage the girls to take part in the many clubs we offer and aim to help them find their 'forever sports'. For our youngest sportswomen in Key Stage 1, we focus on building a solid foundation of core physical skills through a programme of multi-activities, games, gymnastics and swimming. In the Summer Term the focus switches to athletics, cricket and tennis.

All girls are encouraged to focus on being the best that they can be, whatever their ability. We teach the rewards of hard work and perseverance and we challenge girls to try new things and not be afraid of making mistakes.

Most importantly, we support the lifelong benefits of taking part in a sport with like-minded girls, having fun and being part of a bigger team.

The girls have access to a range of competitive inter-school and intra-school House competitions in all our major sports. Girls develop a strong sense of team pride and belonging, and build their communication and teamwork skills whilst always demonstrating the highest levels of sportsmanship.

All girls are encouraged to focus on being the best that they can be, whatever their ability.









Performing Arts

Music

All Tormead Prep and Pre-Prep girls participate in music lessons with specialist teachers from Reception to Year 6.

Extra-curricular music at Tormead Prep is lively and flourishing, and involves pupils from across the whole age range of the school working together. We offer a wide range of opportunities in which all girls are encouraged to participate at a level appropriate to their ability.

Prep girls have the opportunity for solo and group performances in our informal Year Group Concerts. In addition, the Pre-Prep Spring Concert gives our younger pupils the chance to show their music performance skills and the Prep Spring Concert showcases the Prep co-curricular music groups, ensembles and choirs.

Individual Music Lessons and M-Tech

Individual instrumental tuition is available from Year 1 onwards on a wide choice of instruments.

M:Tech is a group instrumental lesson (6 pupils maximum) teaching creative composition digitally with a clear graded learning curve.

Drama

All Tormead Prep and Pre-Prep girls enjoy drama lessons within the curriculum. Lessons encourage girls to be imaginative and to think and act creatively, to explore and to speak, listen and respond to each other. We aim to develop the lifelong skills of self-confidence, enquiry, empathy and collaboration. In curriculum drama, all the girls can become involved in the process where they make decisions and shape their own work.

Performance is an important part of drama and all girls from Reception to Year 6 will 'trip the light fantastic' on our Prep school stage in class assemblies and in the annual House poetry event.

In addition, each year group presents a performance/production staged in the Prep School Hall or the Senior School Hall/JCS Theatre.

We actively incorporate visiting theatre groups and external visits to theatre productions in our calendar thus providing our girls with a love of the performing arts.

Speech and Drama

Speech and Drama lessons are aimed at developing girls' confidence, communication and performance skills through small-group drama tuition.

The main focus of the lessons is preparation for graded exams (which are the drama equivalent to music grades) and performances in Performing Arts Festivals.

Students take part in a range of fun drama activities that develop skills in acting, voice-work, posture, teamwork and self-expression, and build confidence for situations such as public speaking and interviews.

In Years 3-5, Speech and Drama is taught in small groups before or after school on Wednesdays or Thursdays. Year 6 have lessons in pairs during the school day on Wednesdays or Thursdays.

Speech and Drama is taught by Ms Rachel Stanton, an experienced drama teacher and formerly a professional actor and director. Ms Stanton is passionate about the benefits of drama in education. She aims to pass on her love of performance, theatre and literature to her students and to help them 'find their voice'.











Extra-curricular Activities

We aim to offer clubs that appeal to all tastes and interests.

Our girls' understanding of and enthusiasm for the world is explored and extended through the huge variety of clubs and activities on offer.

Grab your wellies and take a walk in our Wild Side outdoor learning area.

We can offer the girls unique and hands-on experiences for learning in our outdoor classroom and woodland area with opportunities to build shelters, learn bushcraft skills, to go bug hunting and to gain an appreciation of nature and the wild. An emphasis is on playful and meaningful activities, which encourage and teach the girls to become risk aware and to collaborate to overcome challenges.

We extend our girls' learning by enriching the subjects we teach through a range of exciting day trips and fun curriculum days in school.

The curriculum is enriched through school trips linked to topics and several times throughout the year, we have whole school outings.

There is nothing more exciting than packing your suitcase for a residential trip with all your friends.

Residential trips take place for girls from Year 3 to Year 6.

Visiting speakers inspire and become firm role models.

Visiting speakers sharing their experiences and expertise is an important part of building knowledge to support our girls' development. A regular feature of life in Prep is a Secret Assembly, which has enriched the lives of all watching and listening. We have welcomed speakers from our Prep and Senior School staff, alumnae and parents. The talks have been truly inspiring with fascinating presentations on a broad range of topics such as women and leadership, sustainability, clinical research, entrepreneurship and architecture to name but a few!







Pre-Prep: the best start

The pastoral care and wellbeing of the girls is at the heart of Tormead Pre-Prep. We believe that happy girls will flourish. The strong, secure relationships that the girls develop enables them to become competent learners who are resilient, capable, independent and self-assured.

The Pre-Prep years are the foundation for your daughter's future development and learning. We provide an exciting and challenging curriculum enabling the girls to fulfil their true potential. We are dedicated to teaching to the preferred learning style of girls.

We have an experienced, knowledgeable and enthusiastic team of staff who are incredibly passionate about the importance of early years education. Girls are in an environment where they feel safe to express themselves and engage. We provide experimental learning, which is how girls learn best. We focus on developing teamwork, which girls prefer, and we develop a growth mindset from a very young age with a 'can do' attitude.

Our Pre-Prep is quite simply buzzing with activity and the joy of learning. The girls are engaged, motivated and keen to share their learning experiences.

We have an experienced, knowledgeable and enthusiastic team of staff who are incredibly passionate about the importance of early years education.

Recognising achievement and effort in our weekly Celebration Assembly

Each week the girls' individual and team achievements and efforts in the curriculum are celebrated. At this time certificates gained for music, sports, drama and times tables challenges are awarded. Prestigious individual awards such as Beacon Awards, Commendations and Head Teacher Commendations are announced and celebrated.

At the end of the year, we hold a formal ceremony which does not only recognise the achievements of the girls with cups and awards but is also a time to reflect on the very busy scholastic year within our curriculum and every day life at Tormead Prep. Here we say goodbye to our Year 6 girls as they move to the next chapter of their educational journey in Senior School.

Tormead is one of only four schools in the UK to have an Olympic sprung floor.

On to Senior School

We expect that our girls will make the move seamlessly 'over the road'.

There is no 11+ assessment for our girls as their progress is tracked through rigorous testing during their time at Tormead Pre-Prep and Prep School. GL Assessments, CAT 4 tests and internal Tormead testing will indicate whether your daughter will flourish academically in the Senior School.

For those girls who are eligible to apply for academic, drama, music, sport and art scholarships, scholarship assessments and interviews will take place in January.

Moving up to the Senior School can seem daunting but we ensure that our girls (and their parents) are thoroughly prepared and feel confident about this next step. In the final term of Year 5, the girls take part in our 'Crossing the Road' transition programme where they get to meet some of the Senior School teachers and enjoy a series of taster lessons such as Chemistry, Computer Science, Food and Nutrition, and Art.

The girls also have an opportunity to meet with their Senior School Form Tutor and new classmates at the 'New Girls' Afternoon' in the term before starting Year 7.



Visiting Tormead Prep

Transport

We currently operate eight routes, using well regarded local coach operators, covering Camberley, Cobham, Cranleigh, Esher, Ewhurst, Farnham, Godalming, Haslemere, Peaslake, Surbiton, Walton, Weybridge, Woking and the surrounding villages.
