Looking ahead to next week, I am delighted to announce our much-anticipated STEM-themed InquisiTOR Week. This year the focus



Alice B presented a fascinating Beacon all about gemstones. 4Y learned lots about the properties of different gemstones and even got to see some of Alice's own collection.




Izzy O presented an amazing Beacon about the life and accomplishments of Coco Chanel. We were all fascinated by her passions and how she paved the way for fashion for women.



Sophia presented an interesting Beacon all about rabbits. She spoke with confidence and the class really enjoyed learning all about rabbits bred in different countries.





We have a pupil in the Prep School who has a severe allergy to sesame products.
