It was lovely to meet so many of you at the Reception Curriculum Evening on Tuesday. Thank you for coming! We have had a super second week together in Reception. This week not only have we celebrated a birthday, we have learnt lots, as well as producing a wonderful piece of winter art. We are looking forward to our first cooking lesson this term on Friday.

Our Learning

This week we have:

- Learnt the sounds **oo** (as in zoom), **oo** (as in book), **ar** and **or**.
- Learnt the tricky words was, you, they.
- Explored 'one more' and 'one less' and composition in Maths.
- Played Maths related games with building blocks, Numicon threading and subitising with dot plates.
- Completed phonics matching activities for last week's sounds **ai**, **ee**, **igh** and **oa**.
- Enjoyed snow themed mark-making pattern cards, snowflake pencil control and cutting activities linked to our winter topic.
- Learnt the names of different vegetables and created our own superhero vegetables linked to the story *Supertato*.
- Written speech bubbles for the characters from Supertato.
- Developed football skills and enjoyed topic related dance in P.E., moving to the beat.

Next week we will:

- Learn the sounds ur, ow, oi and ear.
- Learn the tricky words my, by and all.
- Explore mass and capacity in Maths and discover how to find a balance.
- Be weighing our 'super vegetables' and exploring which ones are heavier and lighter.
- Continue to learn about real life superheroes and people who help us.
- Take part in a STEM workshop for InquisiTOR Week.

Show & Tell

I mentioned at the Curriculum Evening that I am making time every day for the girls to participate in 'Show & Tell'. This will take place immediately after morning registration and afternoon registration. I believe this is a great opportunity for both building up the girls' creative and literacy skills, whilst also helping to grow their confidence. Please could I politely request that they only bring in one item per week and that they have something interesting to tell us about it. If I receive 18 'Show & Tells' in one day, then your daughter may have to wait for a day or two while we work our way through them. It is also not compulsory, so there is no pressure to take part. Beacon Project


Suggested activities:
