Dear Tormead Families,

We began the week with an assembly led by Miss Meech, our Head of Science. She introduced National Science Week and set the girls not one, but two fantastic competitions. In the first challenge Miss Meech has invited all pupils to combine their artistic and scientific prowess into creating a poster that reflects any aspect of time that captures their imaginations. Five exceptional entries will be selected by Miss Meech and me to represent our school in a national Science competition. The winners will not only receive recognition but will proudly highlight our school's talent on a larger platform. In addition to the poster competition, Miss Meech introduced an optional challenge - the Science Selfie! Your daughters have been encouraged to submit a photo of themselves engaging in a science activity, accompanied by a brief sentence explaining the scientific concept being explored. This is a wonderful opportunity for your daughters to showcase their practical understanding of science in action in a unique way. We trust that your daughters will embrace these challenges set with enthusiasm, and we eagerly anticipate thoughtful and imaginative entries.

The deadline for the Science TIME poster is Wednesday 20 March and the deadline for the Science SELFIE is Wednesday 17 April.

I am delighted to share that a selection of pupils from Years 5 and 6 had the opportunity to tour the Houses of Parliament and take part in a debating workshop. Members of the Y5 and 6 Debating Club, the Y6 School Council Permanent Members and speech-writing competition winners were eager to share their experience upon their return to Tormead. They had clearly enjoyed visiting the seat of British politics and experiencing a glimpse into that world. I would like to thank Miss Hogan who organised this visit and the team of accompanying teachers, Mrs Price, Mrs Flack and Miss Bleby, for ensuring the students had such an enriching experience.

Today, we celebrated World Book Day with great enthusiasm and joy. Our pupils embraced the magic of storytelling, with some pupils dressing up as their favourite literary characters and others dressed ready for a bedtime story. It was heart-warming to see the creativity and love for books displayed. The love of reading for pleasure is something I am very mindful we need to encourage at all times. In 2023, the National Literacy Trust recorded the lowest level of reading enjoyment since they had started asking children and young people in 2005. The statistics in their annual literacy survey, for pupils aged 5 to 18 years, is a caution that we have heeded here at Tormead Prep. We have ensured an additional timetabled slot, TO-READ, for the girls to have 15 mins daily reading times and we have offered weekly book clubs to pupils in Y3 to Y6. I continue to ask your support in encouraging your daughters to read for pleasure so that they understand the huge benefits it brings in all areas of the curriculum.

Next week's newsletter will feature photographs from World Book Day and news of the visit from the esteemed author, Sam Steward. The visit was thoroughly enjoyed by all, and we cannot wait to share the highlights with you.

Congratulations to the U10 gymnastics team who competed at the weekend. Evie, Grace, Georgina, Primrose and Zara secured a win, becoming ISGA Champions. Well done!

As we approach the end of the Spring Term, it is with mixed emotions that I announce career progressions and success for two valued members of staff who will be leaving the Prep School.

After three years of dedicated service, Mrs Price, our Deputy Head, will be taking on the post of Director of Teaching and Learning at the Senior School. Mrs Price has been a powerhouse of energy and enthusiasm and will be greatly missed by pupils, colleagues, and not least, me! In a separate communication, I have detailed the transition plan for Mrs Price regarding her role, which will see her spending some time with us in the Prep over the Summer Term before a newly appointed Deputy Head takes over the reins in September 2024.

Madame Newman, our Prep French teacher, has decided to embark on a new and exciting journey outside the teaching profession. In Monday's assembly, I expressed my gratitude for her commitment, enthusiasm for sharing her love of the French culture and language with pupils from Y3 to Y6. We wish her all the best in

her new career path. Originally leaving at the end of the week, in a change of plan, Madame Newman will now be teaching her final lessons next week. In the final week of the Spring Term, French lessons will be covered by Senior School staff from the languages department.

Madame Hoo will be joining our Prep team taking over Madame Newman's role to teach French in the Summer Term. I am excited to welcome her and I am confident that her expertise and passion for French will continue to enrich our pupils' language learning experience. In preparation for her arrival, I asked Madame Hoo to share a short bio:

I am absolutely thrilled to be joining Tormead Prep as the new KS2 French teacher. I am passionate about the importance of language learning and believe that it is key for children to be encouraged, have curiosity and build confidence in languages from an early age. We also have two daughters in the Prep School and Tormead's emphasis on learning a range of languages was one of the (many!) aspects that attracted us to the school. I have lived abroad for over ten years and have worked in a number of French speaking countries including Togo, Rwanda, Switzerland and most recently Belgium before returning to the UK in the summer of 2023. Sukhi also presented a Beacon about Laura Dekker. It was thoroughly enjoyed by the class and contributed towards an informative class discussion.





Instructions

Encourage children to think about time — what it means to them and how it relates to the science they've learnt about — to come up with ideas to include in their poster. Here are some points and questions to get you going:

- Get children to think about their own time how do they spend it? At home, out playing in the park, arts and crafts, learning at school?
- What about time in the world, and beyond? How do we measure time − seconds, days, seasons, centuries? What about time in space?
- Are there any scientists they know of whose work relates to time? What about time travel in films, TV and music?

Make your poster

Once they've done their thinking, it's time for children to get creative! Posters must be A4 or A3 in size and you'll need to be able to take a photograph of each one so it can be sent to us online for judging. Children can use popup pictures, pull out tabs or materials such as pencils, paints, crayons and paper to create their posters.

Send us your poster

Posters will be judged on creativity, how well they fit the theme, how well they have been made or drawn, and how engaging they are. Once a child's poster is complete, take a photo of it and complete the online form to submit it as an entry.


